# Microsoft 365: Installing OneDrive on Windows

### Step 1: Check for OneDrive Installation

OneDrive is pre-installed on Windows 10 and Windows 11. To check if it's installed:

1. Click on the **Start** menu.
2. Type **OneDrive** in the search bar.
3. If it appears in the search results, it is already installed.

### Step 2: Download OneDrive (if not installed)

#### A. Visit the OneDrive Download Page:

Go to the [OneDrive download page](#).

#### B. Download OneDrive:

Click on the **Download** button to download the OneDrive setup file.

### Step 3: Install OneDrive

#### A. Run the Installer:

1. Locate the downloaded setup file (usually in your Downloads folder).
2. Double-click the **OneDriveSetup.exe** file to run the installer.

#### B. Follow the installation prompts:

The installation will begin automatically. Follow the prompts to complete the installation.

### Step 4: Set Up OneDrive

#### A. Launch OneDrive:

1. After installation, OneDrive should start automatically. If not, search for OneDrive in the Start menu and open it.
2. Enter your Microsoft account email and password.
3. Click **Sign in**.

#### B. Choose your OneDrive folder Location:

1. You can choose the default location for your OneDrive folder or select a different location.
2. Click **Next**.

#### C. Select Folders to Sync:

1. Choose which folders you want to sync to your PC. You can sync everything or select specific folders.
2. Click **Next**.

**D. Complete Setup:**

1. Click Open my OneDrive folder to access your synced files.
2. You will see the OneDrive cloud icon in the system tray, indicating that OneDrive is running.
